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What is Interagency Coordination?

- **“The Coordination that occurs between agencies of the US Government, including the Department of Defense, for the purpose of accomplishing an objective” - JP 3-08**
- **Interagency Coordination is integrated throughout both Commands . . . not a separate function.**
- ***We at N-NC include:***
 - US Government Agencies
(Dept of Homeland Security, State, Transportation, Health and Human Services, etc)
 - Non-Government Agencies
(Red Cross, Humanitarian Int'l Service Group, etc)
 - Private Sector Organizations
(Academic, business, professional)

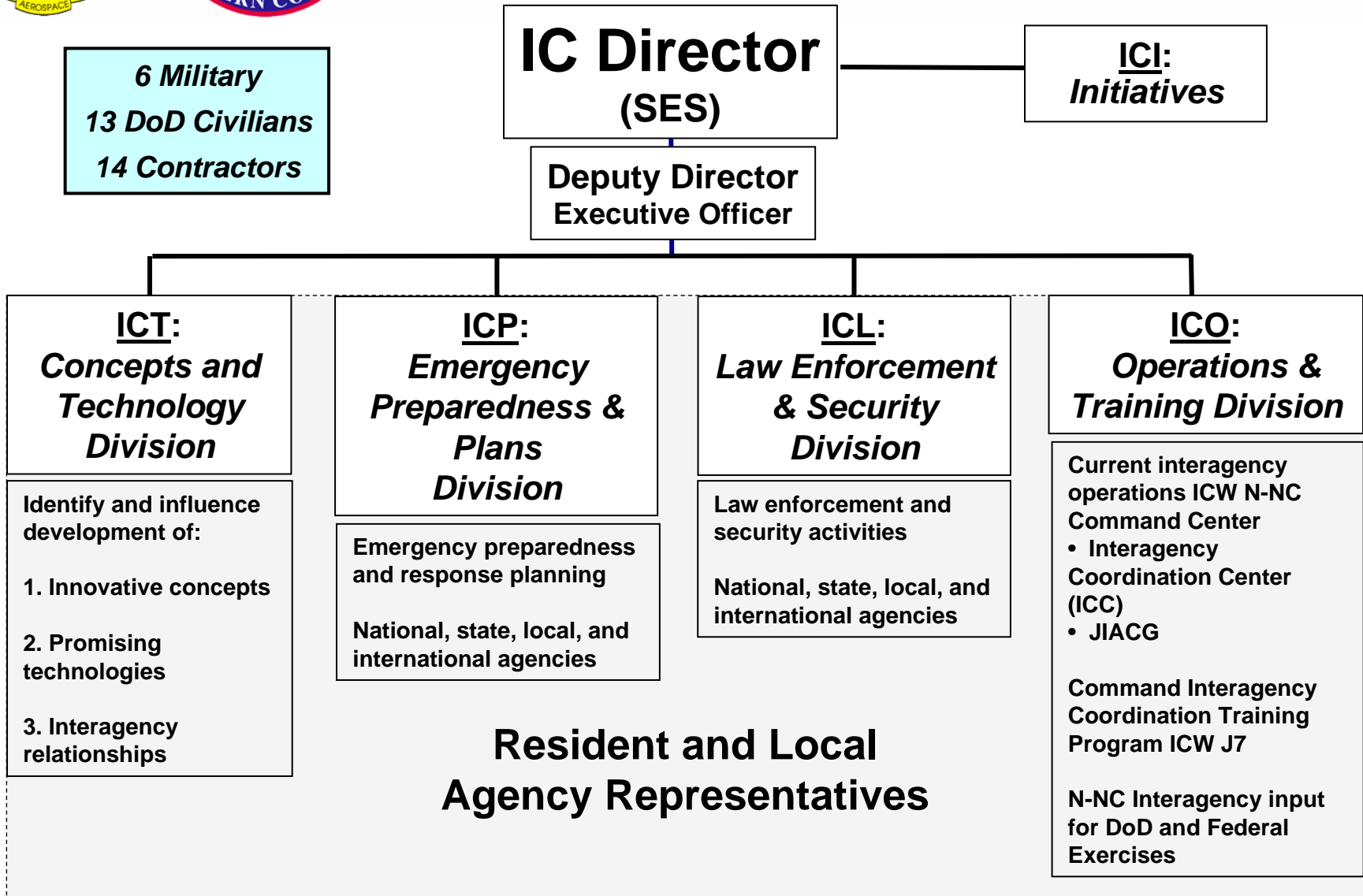

IC Directorate - What We Do



- **Provide Interagency context to Commander's decision making processes**
- **Provide Interagency perspective to N-NC staff and DoD perspective to external Agencies**
- **Anticipate N-NC requests for assistance through National Response Plan (NRP) framework**
- **Administer Commander's Joint Interagency Coordination Group (JIACG)**
- **Operate the Interagency Coordination Group (ICG) "Battle Cell"**



JIACG - Supports operational planning & initiatives day to day

- Provides Interagency situational awareness, Interagency assessments, Interagency reach back (Resident and 'Virtual' membership), and synthesis of Interagency information
- Working Groups formed for issues of interest....

Law Enforcement, DCO/FCO, Pandemic Flu, Earthquake, Pre-scripted Mission Assignments, Private Sector, etc

ICG – The Interagency Coordination Group (“Battle Cell”)

- Interagency coordination focus point for Agency reps during exercises or contingency operations
- Provides the non-DoD perspective/picture to the Commander
- Anticipates gaps/seams that may lead to DoD missions

NRP Coordinating Federal Agencies: USDA - Animal Health Issues
DHHS - Human Health Issues; DOS – International Issues

DOD Implications:

NC Phase III when directed by SECDEF - Prevention and Mitigation
Potential Civil Unrest (MSLEA)
Force Readiness and Deployability (Movement Restrictions/Sick-outs)
DSCA approval process is unlikely to keep pace
HD priorities will be an issue
Economy Act requests will compete with DSCA & HD
RFAs for ESF #8 - Public Health & Medical Services will be overwhelmed

DOS: Working to improve surveillance and laboratory capacity in Nigeria

DHHS: Declared Public Health Emergency. Deployed a Secretary's Emergency Response Team (SERT).

USDA: Expanding USDA's domestic testing and early warning systems for H5N1 in poultry

DOL/OSHA: Issued guidance for protecting medical workers
