# **Women in the United States Congress, 1917-2013: Biographical and Committee Assignment Information, and Listings by State and Congress**

## Summary

One hundred two women currently serve in the 113<sup>th</sup> Congress: 82 in the House (63 Democrats and 19 Republicans) and 20 in the Senate (16 Democrats and 4 Republicans). One hundred one women were initially sworn in to the 113<sup>th</sup> Congress, one female Republican House Member has since resigned, and two Democratic House Members have been elected. This is higher than the previous record number of 95 women who were initially elected to the 111<sup>th</sup> Congress.

The first woman elected to Congress was Representative Jeannette Rankin (R-MT, 1917-1919, 1941-1943). The first woman to serve in the Senate was Rebecca Latimer Felton (D-GA). She was appointed in 1922 and served for only one day.

A total of 298 women have served in Congress, 194 Democrats and 104 Republicans. Of these women, 254 (165 Democrats, 89 Republicans) have served only in the House of Representatives; 34 (21 Democrats, 13 Republicans) have served only in the Senate; and 10 (8 Democrats, 2 Republicans) have served in both houses. These figures include four non-voting Delegates, one each from Guam, Hawaii, the District of Columbia, and the U.S. Virgin Islands. Of the 44 women who have served in the Senate, 14 were first appointed and 5 were first elected to fill unexpired terms.

A total of 33 African American women have served in Congress (1 in the Senate, 32 in the House), including 17 serving in the 113<sup>th</sup> Congress. Ten Hispanic women have been elected to the House; nine serve in the 113<sup>th</sup> Congress. Nine Asian Pacific American women have served in the Congress (8 in the House, 1 in both the House and Senate), including seven in the 113<sup>th</sup> Congress.

Nineteen women in the House, and 10 women in the Senate, have chaired committees. In the 113<sup>th</sup> Congress, one woman chairs a House committee, and five women chair Senate committees, with one female Senator chairing two committees.

This report includes biographical information, including the names, committee assignments, dates of service, listings by Congress and state, and (for Representatives) congressional districts of the 297 women who have served in Congress. It will be updated when there are relevant changes in the makeup of Congress.

## Introduction

Two hundred ninety-eight women have been elected or appointed to the U.S. Congress.<sup>1</sup> Jeannette Rankin (R-MT) has the distinction of being the first woman elected to serve in Congress. On November 9, 1916, she was elected to the House of Representatives as Montana's Representative-at-Large to the 65<sup>th</sup> Congress (1917-1919).<sup>2</sup>

Since Rankin's election, 297 additional women have served in Congress. These 298 women include

- 194 Democrats and 104 Republicans;
- 254 (165 Democrats, 89 Republicans) women have served only in the House of Representatives;
- 34 (21 Democrats, 13 Republicans) women have served only in the Senate;
- 10 (8 Democrats, 2 Republicans) women have served in both houses; and
- 4 (3 Democrats, 1 Republican) women have served as Delegates in the House.<sup>3</sup>

One hundred two women serve in the 113<sup>th</sup> Congress:<sup>4</sup>

- 20 in the Senate (16 Democrats and 4 Republicans), and
- 82 in the House (63 Democrats and 19 Republicans). Three of the women who serve in the House are Delegates, representing the District of Columbia, Guam, and the U.S. Virgin Islands; all are Democrats.
- Not including Delegates, women currently hold 79 (18.1%) seats in the House of Representatives and 20 (20%) seats in the Senate, totaling 99 (18.5%) of the 535 voting seats in the 113<sup>th</sup> Congress.
- Including Delegates, women currently hold 82 seats in the House of Representatives, increasing the total to 102 seats (18.8%) in the entire Congress.

This report includes biographical information, including the names, committee assignments, dates of service, listings by Congress and state, and (for Representatives) congressional districts of the 298 women who have served in Congress. It will be updated when there are relevant changes in the makeup of Congress.

<sup>2</sup> Rep. Rankin served from 1917 to 1919 and from 1941 to 1943. Rep. Rankin was also the only Member of Congress to vote against America's entry into both World Wars.

<sup>3</sup> The total number of female Members of the House includes one Delegate to the House of Representatives from Hawaii prior to statehood, one from the District of Columbia, one from Guam, and one from the U.S. Virgin Islands.

<sup>4</sup> The 113<sup>th</sup> Congress began with 101 women Members. One woman Republican Representative has since resigned, and two women Democratic Representatives have been elected. Information in this section is current as of the date of the report.

<sup>5</sup> Prior to the adoption of the Twentieth Amendment to the U.S. Constitution, effective October 15, 1933, the terms of Representatives and Senators began on March 4, in conformance with a resolution of the Continental Congress implementing the Constitution (adopted September 13, 1788). The Twentieth Amendment provides inter alia that the terms of Representatives and Senators shall commence at noon on January 3, in the year following their election. The first Congress affected by the Twentieth Amendment was the 74<sup>th</sup> (1935-1937). Members elected to fill a vacancy are sworn in and commence their terms as soon as possible, as do Senators appointed to fill a vacancy.
