## **London VBIED Attempt: June 29, 2007**

Early this morning, the London (UK) police responded to a report of a suspicious vehicle in Haymarket near Piccadilly Circus, which is the city's busy nightclub and theater district. Upon arrival, the police determined that the car was an apparent vehicle-borne improvised explosive device (VBIED). According to Scotland Yard reports, the vehicle contained propane canisters and nails. The device was rendered safe by bomb disposal personnel.

The Emergency Management and Response—Information Sharing and Analysis Center (EMR-ISAC) has no information indicating a terrorist attack in the United States is imminent. Nevertheless, it is prudent that all Emergency Services Sector personnel remain vigilant for suspicious people, actions, and devices or packages. Recognizing that terrorists remain determined to attack America, being observant for their activity is particularly relevant at this time as the nation prepares to celebrate its Independence Day on 4 July.

The EMR-ISAC team will continue to monitor this situation and provide additional bulletins if there is a change to the Homeland Security Advisory System, which currently remains at the Elevated Condition (YELLOW).
