### [Nebraska Receipt, Stage, and Store \(RSS\) Panhandle Strategic National Stockpile \(SNS\) Full Scale Exercise AAR/IP](#)

The Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services in coordination with the state of Nebraska conducted a RSS/SNS exercise that tested the State of Nebraska's ability to receipt, stage, and store the SNS. The exercise tested the ability of how the agency would respond to a release of SNS assets in addition to testing the health department's capability to mobilize efforts.


### [Solano Countywide School Takeover Response Scenarios Training 2013 AAR/IP](#)

Solano County conducted a county-wide training on school takeovers. The scenario focused on multiple terrorists entering Solano County Community college and seizing the building. This two day event included a classroom setting training and field exercise. Training reviewed lessons learned, case studies, and tactics needed for response. The field exercise including role play, victims, and hostages.

### [White Powder Anthrax Attack Tabletop Exercise \(TTX\) AAR/IP](#)

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment participated in a White Powder Anthrax Attack TTX to test capabilities in emergency public information & warning, medical surge, medical material management & distribution, responder safety & health, and volunteer management. The exercise provided participants with an opportunity to gain an understanding of the challenges they could face in responding to a public health disaster.
