Enclosed please find five copies of the Final Exercise Report for the Robert E. Ginna NPS Plume Pathway Exercise conducted on May 22, 2007.


The State of New York and local emergency response organizations successfully demonstrated the capabilities to implement their off-site radiological emergency response plans and procedures, based on the evaluation of this exercise by the Regional Assistance Committee (RAC) and a team of Federal evaluators. There were no deficiencies, although three Areas Requiring Corrective Actions were identified.

Please note, the RAC is currently reviewing State and local plans and will provide suggestions for improvement under separate cover when this review is completed.

State and local preparedness remains adequate to protect the health and safety of the public living in the vicinity of the Robert E. Ginna NPS and provides reasonable assurance that appropriate measures can be taken offsite in the event of a radiological emergency.
