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### **1. (U) Scope Note**

(U) The Piracy Analysis and Warning Weekly (PAWW) Report is a review of recent Somali piracy incidents and an outlook on threats around the Horn of Africa.

### **2. (U) Piracy Events**

(U) This section provides information on piracy events for this week in the vicinity of the Horn of Africa.

#### **A. (U) Summary**

(U) Pirate attacks this week were below levels seen in previous weeks of the monsoon season. There were two hijackings, one in the Arabian Sea and another in the Somali Basin.

#### **B. (U) Details**

- **(U) Vessels Hijacked**

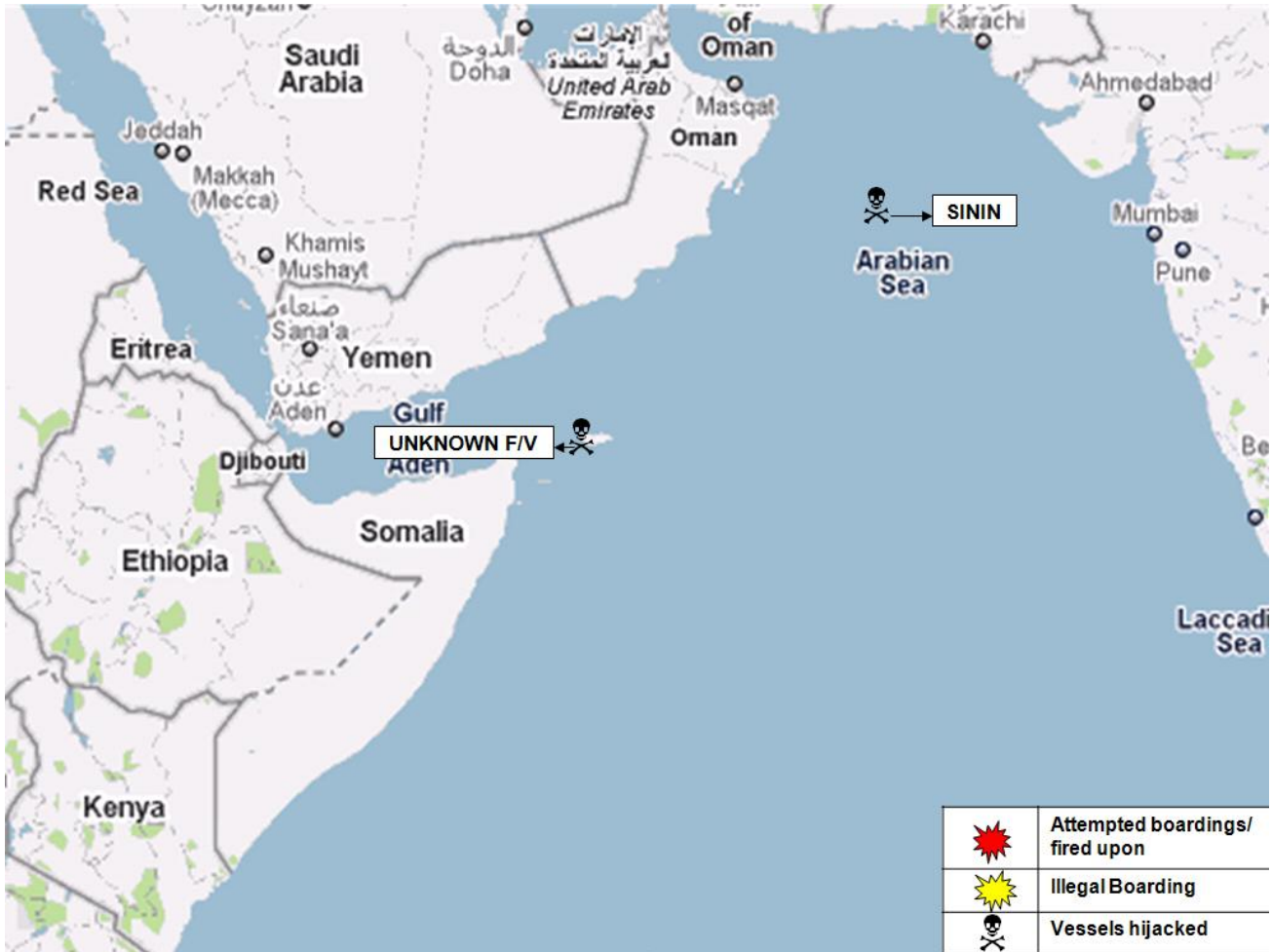
(U) INDIAN OCEAN: Fishing vessel was hijacked 13 Feb while underway in position 12:00N - 053:02.1E, approximately 8NM south of Socotra Island, Yemen. The vessel has a crew of eight. (IMB)

(U) INDIAN OCEAN: Bulk carrier (SININ) was hijacked 12 Feb at 1218 UTC while underway in position 20:15.43N – 064:16.09E, approximately 280NM SE of Ras al Had, Oman. The vessel, which has a crew of 23, sent out a distress signal. A coalition aircraft was sent to the area, and noticed two suspected pirate skiffs onboard the ship. (IMB)

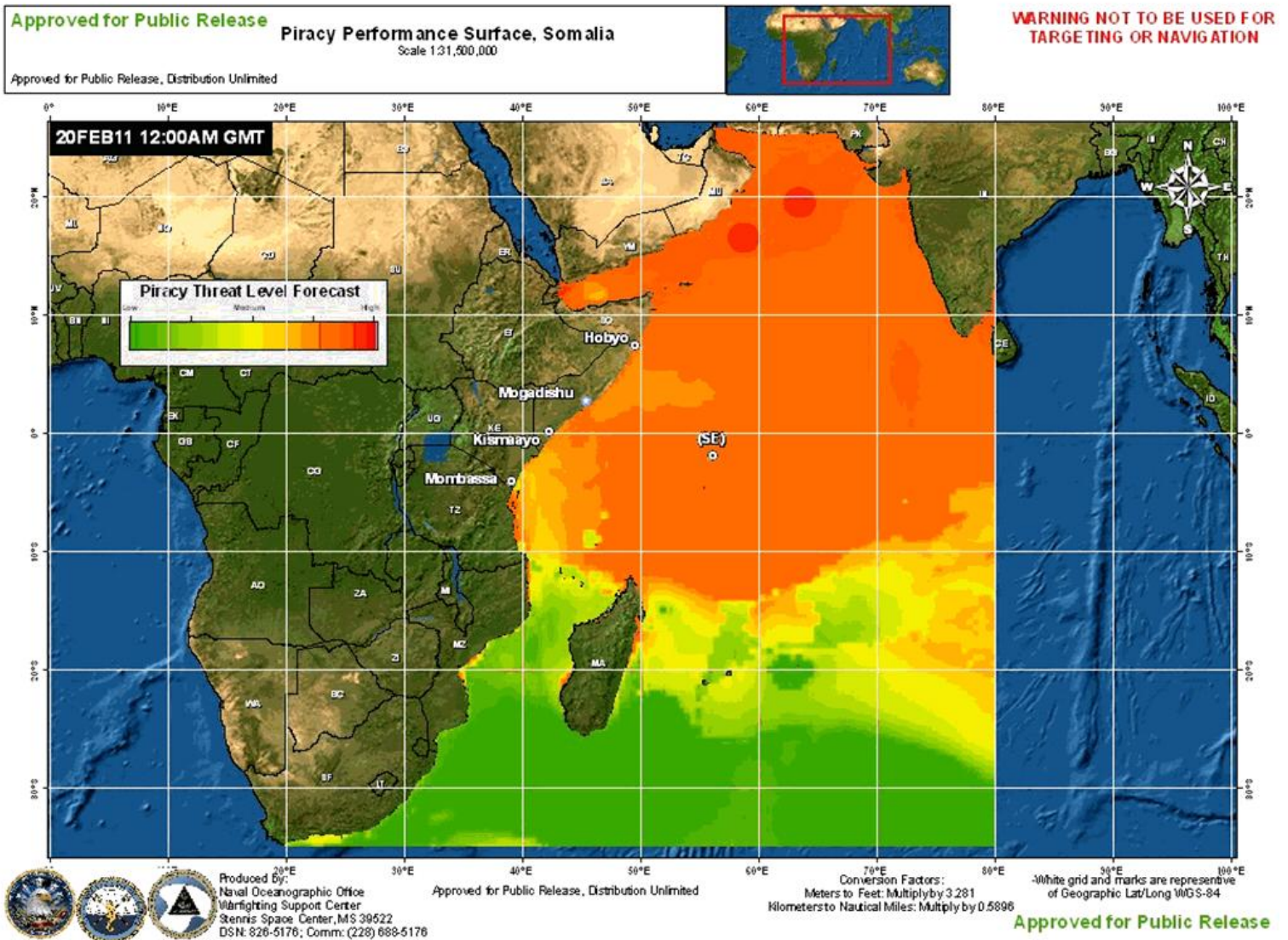
(U) Table 1 is a summary of piracy events that have occurred this week, this month, and current/prior years.

### 3. (U) Outlook

#### A. (U) Summary

(U) Weather conditions are expected to remain relatively calm despite the current monsoon season, creating conditions conducive to small boat activity throughout the piracy operating area, particularly in the Arabian Sea, Somali Basin, and Gulf of Aden. It should be noted that while attack levels have decreased this week, there are still a number of suspicious approaches reported, indicating pirate operations are ongoing.

### (U) Terminology and References

(U) This appendix is provided to promote consistent use of accurate terms of reference in reporting and also identifies those references that were used to gather the information contained in this report. Please note that these terms relate to observable activity and are independent of target vessel status and exclude actions by governmental authorities in lawful pursuit of their authority.

#### (U) Terms of Reference

(U) The following terms are adopted to describe the range of criminal anti-shipping activity and impediments to safe navigation in our worldwide reporting and analysis:

- (U) **Attempted Boarding** - Close approach or hull-to-hull contact with report that boarding paraphernalia were employed or visible in the approaching boat.
- (U) **Blocking** - Hampering safe navigation, docking, or undocking of a vessel as a means of protest.
- (U) **Boarding** – Unauthorized boarding of a vessel by persons not part of its complement without successfully taking control of the vessel.
- (U) **Firing Upon** - Weapons discharged at or toward a vessel.
- (U) **Hijacking** - Unauthorized seizure and retention of a vessel by persons not part of its complement.
- (U) **Kidnapping** - Unauthorized forcible removal of persons belonging to the vessel from it.
- (U) **Robbery** - Theft from a vessel or from persons aboard the vessel.
- (U) **Suspicious Approach** - All other unexplained close proximity of an unknown vessel.
